



Commercial Customers Purchasing More AEgis Flight Simulators

AEgis Technologies continues to sell its Vampire UAS flight simulator to several commercial customers, as its product's business-related uses continue to climb in popularity.

"It's training software that allows operators to learn, make mistakes, in a virtual environment before they go out and do live flight with real unmanned systems," says AEgis Technologies vice president of business development Del Beilstein.

More than 4,000 Vampire systems were delivered to the United States Department of Defense over the past five years. These flight-training classroom simulation products give users lifelike virtual environments to fly in, and Beilstein says it is less expensive to use this product in comparison to live training.

"They haven't violated any actual airspace, they haven't crashed a vehicle and there's no cost for replacement no maintenance required."

While this simulator was originally designed for the military, AEgis looks to continue capitalizing on the increased demand for this classroom system. The Vampire was recently sold to customers in Detroit, Michigan and Dayton, Ohio.

"This is going to be a nationwide issue in how you train and certify UAS operators before we send them out into the world and let them actually operate," Beilstein says, "We're really excited to be on the cutting edge of that."
